3.1 Acceptance and signing of the Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 9 November 2023

3.2 Matters Arising from the Minutes Vacancy Notice

The Clerk confirmed having sent the Councill Vacancy Notice to the Siddington Park Retirement Home.

Rubbish in Wit Pit Lane Layby

It was reported that there are now 5 caravans parked in the layby off Wit Pit Lane. It was agreed that these are on private land owned by the Abbey Home Farm estate and, therefore, not the responsibility of the Local Authority.

4. Co-Option to Fill the Vacancy

The Chairman has approached a resident of Siddington Park Retirement Home without success.

5. County and District Councillors – Cllr Lisa Spivey and Cllr Mike Evemy Cllr Lisa Spivey - unavailable

- The Clerk was asked to contact Cllr Spivey about flooding on the Cirencester Road and the damaged and faulty drains in Preston.
- It was noted that the footpath between Witpit Lane and Driffield has been reconstructed.

Development on Kingshill Lane

- CDC has refused an application for 280 houses but the developer is now challenging the 5-year land supply. CDC has confirmed that the Local Plan shows a 6.9-year supply.
- **Consultation on the Local Plan** is open from 1 February for 6 weeks. This version includes an update of environmental policies. It will be possible to submit a partial update of 42 out of the 60 policies.
- Planners will then start a full update to ensure that policies are robust enough to stand challenge.
- By carrying out the update early, the cost will be less than leaving it until the later date of 2031.
- Attention will be given to looking at more development and where that is e.g. Moreton in Marsh.
- Development in Cirencester is going slowly.
- Michael Gove has set a deadline of 30 June 2025 after which a different process could come into force especially if there is a change of Government following the forthcoming General Election.
- How will LP affect our NDP ? The Local Plan takes precedence over any NDP.

- Garden waste collections will re-start next week. Christmas trees can be collected without being cut up.
- CDC will be setting the Budget next month.
