A gardener's guide

As the frost melts, if you're anything like me, you are wandering around your garden, looking sadly at everything that has been flattened, frozen and frazzled.

But don't worry! That's the beauty of nature, particularly in the spring. The snowdrops, crocuses and aconites will perk up as the weather warms, and any perennials that had started to show their green will recover and put on new growth.

And any shrubs that look brown or dead - don't be too hasty in cutting them back. Wait until the green shoots appear in spring before pruning out the dead.

In the meantime, take advantage of the tentative warmer weather by tackling some of these seasonal tasks:

- 1. Give your wisteria its winter prune by taking the long growth back to 3 buds.
- 2. Prune your roses back to a third of last year's growth. Prune to just above an outward facing bud.
- 3. Once cut back and weeded, mulch your borders to give them a good feed and keep further weeds at bay!
